## From Pastor Kohl

Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

We finally made it through February. It was a tough month here at church: we had to cancel one service and few people came to the one the following week. It's been a tough time, not only because the expenses to maintain and operate the ministries we do still continue, but without the community gathering, something very important is missing from our lives; that is the promises of forgiveness and mercy we hear and taste and experience in Jesus' presence with us.

But now we move to March, a month filled with promises. Not only is the first day of spring coming this month (as well as J.S. Bach's birthday, March 21, when I first met my wife), but also Holy Week and Easter will cap off this month.

Our life together is really about promise. But sometime people misunderstand that and think that it is about us being faithful to the promises we made. This understanding turns the whole of Christianity on its head. Our life, our hope is grounded in the promises which God makes to us: in baptism, in the word of forgiveness, in Holy Communion, and in the ways we live together. Grace, indeed, abounds when Jesus comes.

So we celebrate the "sacred mysteries" every Sunday as we remember that "Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again." This truth we proclaim every Sunday in the prayer at the table right before we receive Holy Communion. And they are important words; the Church has proclaimed them for centuries.

But there is something I would like to ask you to think when we say these words. Simply add the phrase "for you" or "for me" to each of them: "Christ has died *for you*. Christ is risen *for you*. Christ will come again *for you*."

On the Wednesdays in Lent, we have gathered for Evening Prayer, and as is traditional among us Lutheran Christians, we are giving thought to the *Small Catechism* of Martin Luther. In this simple book, Luther takes the great truths of our faith and makes them personal but teaching us that all God did, all God promises, all God has, is *for you*. That's one of the reasons we always say at distribution of Holy Communion, "the body of Christ given *for you*. The blood of Christ given *for you*." Those little words—*for you*—are the important proclamation that all of God's actions are for you.

Come celebrate the hope we have of God's promises fulfilled, every Sunday and at all services of Holy Week. Jesus has done so much for us. Celebrating that is an important thing to do.

## FROM PASTOR HARRIS

Dear Friends of Christ,

March is an exciting time in the life of the Church this year. We have Lent, Passion/Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter Day.

My favorite is the portion of Holy Week called the Great Three Days (or the Pascal Triduum). This is Mandy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. It could be said these together is the most important worship service we have. In fact, these three are taken together—they are one service, one liturgy. People just get to leave the building for a bit. This is an old service. If you wish to get a good outline of Christianity, show up to these three (one) liturg-ies/y. It's like a mini-confirmation camp. In fact, Easter Vigil is a traditional time for baptism, capping a catechesis that occurred during Lent and Holy Week. Saint Augustine referred to the Easter Vigil as "the mother of all vigils".

Many familiar stories are heard during these days. Stories of God's action in the lives of humans. Of course the death and resurrection of Jesus is central. We hear the stories of the Lord's supper, foot washing, creation, the parting of the Red Sea, and the fiery furnace.

There is singing and music. Some might say it is an emotional roller coaster (just like our lives).

Many of you may have been to one or two nights of the liturgy. Consider making all three part of your Lenten and Easter devotion. Some have said these three together are life changing.

## **Report from the Congregation Council Meeting of February 2012**

The Accountability Team for Mission reminded the council of the work it needs to do beginning with a study of its role according to the constitution of the congregation. Quarterly letters to the congregation will be sent to all members of Pilgrim Church.

The minutes of the Annual Meeting of Sunday, January 27, 2013 were approved by the council.

The council received with regret the resignations of Lou Cardillo and Lisa Lepore.

The council discussed the concern about two major snow days in February and its impact on our budget. All members are encouraged to help with these Sundays' smaller offerings. As always, Simply Giving is a great way to continue support for our ministries when attendance is not possible. An application for this program is included on page 9 of this *Pilgrims' Progress*, which can be removed (the reverse side is blank), filled out, and returned in the offering plate or to the Financial Secretary's mailbox in the church office.

A letter of thanks and encouragement in ministry was sent by Bishop Hazelwood. This letter was read to the council. It is posted on the bulletin board near the church offices.

## **Easter Vigil**

For the past several years, Pilgrim has celebrated the great Easter Vigil, the last of the three days (Triduum) and the first service of Easter. It is an awe-inspiring service beginning outside in the labyrinth where the baptismal fire is lit; following this is a procession into the chapel where the beautiful *Exultet*, rejoicing in all of God's creation, is sung.

Next we read Old Testament Bible passages depicting parts of our salvation story. The movement is then to the narthex where there may be a baptism, but in any case, we remember our own baptisms.

Finally, the doors of the sanctuary are opened, there is an organ fanfare and we worship the glory of our resurrected Lord. Following the service refreshments of celebration are served in the Christian Life Center. People are needed to take part in the various aspects of the service. Particularly needed is a responsible acolyte, readers, communion assistants, and people to bring food and organize the time of refreshment; a sign-up sheet will follow. Thanks.

## **Toiletry Ministry**

Pilgrim's Toiletry Ministry is going strong, averaging about 25 people every third Thursday morning of the month at 10:00. We have tried to combine some regularly given items with some different items from time to time.

Last month we provided dish washing detergent and dish towels, and this month we will be donating cleaning products and paper towels. We continue to be in need of the hotel/travel size shampoo, conditioner, lotion, soaps, and toothpaste. We are always in need of toothbrushes, large sized bottles of shampoo and conditioner, feminine hygiene products and toilet paper.

## Sunday Readings – March 2013

### March 3 –Lent 3

#### Isaiah 55:1–9

The prophet proclaims that God is near. God is near to bring undeserved blessings.

#### 1 Corinthians 10:1–13

Paul uses the history of Israel as a teaching tool for the church in Corinth and for us today.

#### Luke 13:1–9

Jesus tells a story about patience and a fig tree. This story follows on his comments about making sense out of injustice and the need for repentance.

### March 10 –Lent 4

#### Joshua 5:9–12

Here we read about the day the manna God provided in the exodus from Egypt ended and people began to eat the crops of the land. We see how God continues to provide for us, even if it is in a new and unexpected way.

#### 2 Corinthians 5:16–21

Reconciliation with God is what God wants for us. In fact God has begun this by sending Jesus whose faithfulness to God's plans shows us what reconciliation looks like.

#### Luke 15:1–3, 11b–32

The Parable of the Prodigal Son shows us the heart of God: always ready to welcome back, always open to the needs of people. We also see that grace is an "unfair" thing because it meets the needs of all. In this we see that the older brother feels cheated, but as the father reminds him, everything was his all the time.

### March 17 – Lent 5

#### Isaiah 43:16–21

Isaiah's poem uses images from the exodus from Egypt to look forward to the time God's people will return from the Babylonian activity. Isaiah reminds them (and us) that the God who did these things in the past is still able to bring liberation in the present time.

#### Philippians 3:4b–14

With language that would shock people if it were translated literally, Paul speaks about his own goodness compared to the gift Jesus brought. Paul knows that our whole life with God is determined by God's previous actions in Jesus.

#### John 12:1–8

Jesus is anointed for his burial at a meal in the house of Lazarus whom Jesus raised from the dead. As so often happens, things that point toward Jesus' death are criticized by someone. In this case, it is Judas who would have liked to see the money for the ointment available for his own use.

### March 24 – Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday

**Isaiah 50:4–9a** The servant of God speaks about serving as a teacher even in his suffering.

Christians understand this servant to be Jesus.

**Philippians 2:5–11** This passage calls us to have the mind of Jesus, a humility that gives glory to God who is bringing all things back into a right relationship for redemption and salvation.

**Luke 23:1–49** All the gospel writers tell us the story of Jesus' death. This year we read Luke's version. The story of Jesus' death is important because it is in his death that we see the depth of God's love for us.

### March 31 – The Resurrection of Our Lord/Easter Day

#### Isaiah 65:17–25

The prophet's vision of the new heaven and earth in which there is nothing but peace and contentment is proclaimed in this text. God is always at work bringing about new things in us, in our faith, in our community in Christ.

#### 1 Corinthians 15:19–26

Hope for Christians is not based in what we experience, our earthly lives. Hope for us is based on the promises which God fulfills in the resurrection of Jesus. As he is, so will we be in the day of resurrection.

#### Luke 24:1–12

The events of Easter are beyond human expectations. That is why an angel must tell the women what has happened to Jesus. In the same way, the good news must be proclaimed to us who know too well our own limitations and sin.


