# From the Pastor

Hell and Stewardship

Dear Fellow Pilgrims:

Before you assume that you know what this letter is about, please give it a read.

As you have probably noted in the *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* book, the Apostles' Creed gives us an alternative to the line in the second article about Jesus descending into hell. We could also say at that point in the creed "he descended to the dead". We don't hear much about hell, and to be honest with you, beside Matthew's Gospel and some parables and the Book of Revelation, hell is not a major theme of the Bible. That is something we might not notice unless someone pointed it out to us.

And yet in some traditions among the Christian family the notion of hell seems to be more prominent that the notion of grace. Many of us were raised with the threat of hell hanging over our heads. Hell was used to make us behave, to keep us from doing bad things. In the ancient cathedrals and parish churches of Europe a depiction of hell was often carved over the doors of the church and might be displayed in the windows as a grim reminded that Christians need to listen to what the church taught or suffer the consequences of their actions by an eternity in hell. I suspect that Dante's Inferno, a part of his extended poem The Divine Comedy, shapes our pictures of hell more than anything else. But remember that work was written as a political statement about life in Dante's world.

Hell was used at the time of the Reformation (1500s) to collect money for building St. Peter's at the Vatican in Rome. This fund raising program was called the sale of indulgences. No indulgence, no forgiveness; a future in purgatory or hell. Indulgences also were supposed to be able to get people already dead closer to heaven by shortening their time in purgatory.


Now that was an effective fund-raising technique! Fear is often a good way to control people and make them do what you want them to do.

But in our tradition as Lutheran Christians it is not fear that motivates our good behavior, our sharing of resources, our following Jesus. We are not Christians out of fear, but rather because we have come to know that transformation happens when we are loved—not forced to do something. Hearts do not change because of fear, but we become new people because we are loved.

As we begin to think about the financial positioning of Pilgrim Church for 2015 and beyond, please do so—not because any of us can buy our way out of judgment and into grace, but because we have been blessed first of all by God, whose heart is filled with love for this whole crazy human family. And if Jesus is the one who shows us what God is like (and we believe he is) then we see a love that will not stop even through the cross. In him we see a God who operates out of God's own self, not as one who can be manipulated by our behavior.

So, what is your reason for giving to the work of Christ through Pilgrim Church, the New England Synod, and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America? It would be interesting to know such things, and probably inspiring to the rest of us. You see, stewardship does not have to be hell. It can be one way we get on board with God's work of healing and restoring God's creation.

We need kids' names, addresses, and phone numbers. Also, letting us know about any special situations or learning styles would be very much appreciated.



# Confirmation 2014-2015

Preparation for the Rite of Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation) is offered for all students between 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grades. This is a ministry Pilgrim Church does along with St. Paul Church in Warwick and Bethany Church in Cranston. Classes meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 until 8:15. Our first meeting is different. It will take place on **Tuesday, September 23** and we will **begin at 7:00 p.m.** We would like all students and a parent/guardian to be at the meeting. The program we have at Pilgrim Church has expectations and involves the families of the students. We would like everybody to understand how this series of classes works.

Over the three years of instruction we cover the Bible, The Small Catechism of Martin Luther, and topics or issues that impact on young people's lives. We want our students to know that as the followers of Jesus our lives are shaped by his principles, not simply what everyone else is doing.

Whenever there is a class for the evening (sometimes there are fellowship or service events) we ask a family or a couple of families together to provide a supper for the students.
