From the Pastor

Dear Friends of Christ,

I was listening to WGBH as I was on the road today. If you listen to that station you probably know what they were doing. It is fundraising time for GBH. The announcer spoke about the nature of fundraising in the way they do it. As she said, "We give you the product first and only then ask you to pay for it."

Her words reminded me of how much the fund raising part of stewardship in the Christian tradition is similar to this. Think about it: God gives us all we need and asks that our lives would be grateful responses to God's gifts. It should not surprise us that in many churches over the years, the gathering of support for ministries happened at the time of year when the harvest from the field has been gathered. Our gifts are a response to God's gifts.

I know well that stewardship is about more than money. It addresses our whole life as well as other things like the environment and friends, family and work, energy we use for heat or light... this list could go on.

But at Pilgrim Church, we are facing a difficult time. We have been blessed in many ways, but without the financial support of all members of our community, we will need to reduce what we do in this community.

You need to know that the ministry of our congregation is only in small part about us as a congregation. If Pilgrim Church were not here, many people would go hungry or without some of the basics of life. This is not overstating the case. Pilgrim Church serves many people and is known in the Warwick community as a church with a warm heart for others. Sometimes agencies and other churches refer people to us for food or toiletries. This is an important part of being in the community.

God's purpose for Pilgrim Lutheran Church is to build our relationships with Jesus and to share our gifts with the community. Praying always - Serving with joy - Teaching - Proclaiming the Good News - Building community But we are also a place where people find guidance and comfort. We are a community whose life is based on the cross and resurrection of Jesus. People within the congregation as well as outside of the congregation come for pastoral conversation. I try my best to turn no one away when they ask for some time. I think it is essential that we need to walk the talk we proclaim. I think of this as authenticity in ministry. I do that because our Lord Jesus did not turn anyone away who looked to him for help.

In November you will be asked, along with the whole community of Pilgrim Church, to share a plan for your financial support of the ministries we do here: worship, learning, service, support. I never know how much people give to the congregation's ministry, but I know that we as a family are moving toward a full tithe of our income. It's a challenge and yet it is amazing that growth in giving can happen when we make it our goal.

The announcer on WGBH also said that you never know when a story they report or even music they play from time to time will make a difference in people's lives. That is true. We grow as we listen and we are often surprised at the things that help us along.

It is no different with the church. Being in worship on any Sunday could make a difference for you. Talking with a brother or sister in the community of Pilgrim Church might help you to find the strength for the day you face. And the difference these things make might change more than just a day; they could be life-changing, as they have been for people throughout the centuries.

It is Jesus who calls us to follow him, and his call always involves sacrifice, rearranging of priorities, a new way to see ourselves and others and the world around us. I believe the Gospel holds hope for the future, but not without us seeking to be new people, praying people, generous people, forgiving people, serving people. That's our life in Christ who gave the best gift for you and me: his lifegiving death. Now, by prayer, we must decide how to respond.
