From the Pastor

Dear Friends.

Maybe you remember it too, a service held in the church I grew up in at this time of the year called "Harvest Home". Our church was located in a rural setting, so this was a service to which people brought the vegetables and fruit from their gardens to be shared with one of the church agencies in our area. I remember the front of the church piled high with all sorts of things, even canned goods or dry goods from people who did not have a garden.

It was for us a sign of the end of the year, a reminder of how good God had been through nature and gardens, and how much good we could do as a congregation when we gathered our gifts together.

In November, the church gives thought to end times, to the harvest which God will gather at the end of time. We remember those who have already been gathered into God's presence: loved ones and members of our community who have died over the past year. That will happen on All Saints Sunday, November 2. Once again this year, you will have the opportunity to come forward and light a candle in memory of your loved ones who rest in God's keeping.

On November 16, we will gather together our estimates for giving in 2015. This is an important event in our life as a congregation. It is important not only because it will enable us to make some plans for what we will do in the coming year, but also important as we demonstrate how we are community, bringing our gifts to be used by God, just as we did at the Harvest Home services of my childhood.

But the bottom line on our gifts to God is that they are first of all God's gifts to us. A part of living as a follower of Jesus, a mark of the life-style of Christians is this important fact: all we have, all we

are, and all we hope to be some day, are gifts from God.

I know that there is a statue of the "Independent Man" on top of our state house, but the truth is that none of us is independent; we are all interdependent, needing other people to know who we are. That's common wisdom. But learning to see everything as a gift from God is what we call stewardship in the church. Stewardship is not just about money and finances; it is a whole way of life, a new vision of ourselves in connection with other people, the world, and the God who loved us enough to send Jesus as our savior.

On Sunday, November 23, we will celebrate Christ the King. There is a baptism planned for that day by which the body of Christ grows in this world. But that is the day we look to the culmination of all things under the rule of Christ, the one who has redeemed us and bought us back from the powers of death. It is a day of hope and reassurance.

You know as I do that there are lots of people and TV programs and media preachers who want you to look at the end of things as a fearful time, a time to dread, a time of punishment. But in the church of Jesus Christ, the end of things is celebrated as the beginning of new things: new earth, new heavens, new bodies, new people who are the children of God and sisters and brothers with Christ.

That is who you are now. The reason we gather every Sunday is to be reminded of that truth. The world will not teach us this. In the world we learn more of our shortcomings and misunderstandings. But in the church, the Gospel is proclaimed which declares what the world does not understand: no matter what happens, no matter where we wander, no matter what our past has been; God's love is there for every one of us.

Maybe you know someone who needs to hear that, and know that made real in bread and wine. Ask them to come along to hear the plans God has for them, for you, and for the whole of God's creation.


Thanksgiving Worship Wednesday, November 26

Advent begins Sunday, November 30



One in seven Americans rely on food banks

One in seven Americans (46 million people) rely on food pantries and meal service programs, according to a study by Feeding America, a network of 200 food banks. And 25 percent of military families, 620,000 households, need help putting food on the table.

"It means that people in America have to make trade-offs," said Bob Aiken, CEO of Feeding America. "They have to pick between buying food for their children or paying for utilities, rent and medicine. ... Hunger exists in literally every county in America. It's an urban problem, it's a suburban problem, and it's a rural problem."

Linda Patterson, executive director of the Lorton [Va.] Community Action Center, said stereotypes of the people who need help are misleading. "The people who come here are hard workers. They are employed. They are the school bus drivers, the lab techs in doctor's offices, receptionists, the janitors who clean the floor of your children's school," she said. "They just can't make ends meet because some kind of crisis has hit them."

The center has seen an 18 percent increase in people who need food assistance since food stamp benefits were cut last November, she said.

The "Hunger in America" study found that of people who use food banks:

- 26 percent are African-American, 20 percent are Hispanic, 43 percent are white and 11 percent are "other".
- 33 percent of households have at least one family member with diabetes.
- 65 percent of households have a child under 18 or someone 60 or older.
