#### From the Pastor

Dear Friends of Christ.

January 1 is commemorated in the church as *The Name of Jesus*. The first reading for that day is Numbers 6:22-27. This reading contains the blessing with which most of our liturgies end:

The Lord bless you and keep you.
The Lord's face shine on you with grace
and mercy.

The Lord look upon you with favor and give you peace.

They are beautiful words to end a time together in God's presence, but they are also beautiful words as we stand once again at the beginning of a new year.

We ask God's blessing with these words. We see the word "bless" around us often. But what does it mean to be blessed? A blessing always involves a change. It might be a perception that changes, it might be a purpose that changes, it might be behavior that changes. But to be blessed is to change. For us this is asking for a deeper awareness of God's presence around us in life. What happens on Sunday is that we are sent out with new eyes, more and more aware of the gifts God gives and the signs that no matter what happens we have a God who seeks to enrich us.

When we ask God to keep us, we are asking for God to be with us. In the *Small Catechism*, Luther describes the work of God the creator as preserving, providing, and protecting. This is what it means to be kept by God: preserved by God, provided for by God, and protected by God.

When we ask for God's face to shine on us it will be with grace and mercy. Jesus is the one who shows us that unexpected gifts and

blessings come from God, not because we are so good, but because God is so good.

In fact the goodness of God is the basis for our faith as the followers of Jesus.

Finally, we ask for God's peace to rest upon us. What our world needs as we come into 2015 is **peace**. There is no doubt about that. Certainly we seek peace as an end to the violence that marks our world. Wars and power struggles, economic injustices, and ignoring the immorality of leaders are so common in our world that we almost accept them as par for the course. And we might think that we can do nothing about such things.

But we have been blessed by God, not just for our own comfort, but to be blessings to others. This means the change that blessings bring to us will shape our lives in the coming year.

So what does all this mean? There is a saying: If you want peace, work for justice. As the people of God we are called not just to look out for ourselves, but also to look out for those whose voices are lost in the world around us. Seeking peace calls us to seek a better life for people who are different from us: race, language, gender identity, educational abilities, economic differences. This list can go on. But Jesus takes it a step further. Jesus calls us to love even our enemies.

How much safer our world would be if power were turned into service, if we sought to follow Jesus more intentionally.

In the face of what feels like overwhelming turmoil there is something we can do: seek to be people of peace, who carry out the blessing with which we end our time together on Sunday mornings. No one of us can do this alone. We need others. That's a major reason why the church gathers every Sunday. We come together not only to be reminded of whose we are, but also to remind one another who we are: the children of God.

If you have any new year resolutions for 2015, you might include this journey to peace among them. Try reading the Bible every day and listening for who God is and what God is up to in the stories and teachings there. Keep a list

of people for whom you pray. Set some time aside every day for quiet time to do this. If you have children in your house, share the highs and lows of the day with them. Then pray for one another. This will teach them your love and bind your family more closely together and closer to God.

As God's pilgrim people, we are always on the go—changing, thinking, seeking new ideas and places to serve. I have a saying on the wall in my office. It was a gift from an Episcopal priest. She gave it to me when I was installed as your pastor over 20 years ago. It is from the writings of Martin Luther:

This life therefore is not righteousness but growth in righteousness, not health but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be but we are growing toward it. The process is not yet finished but it is going on. This is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory but all is being purified.

With prayers for strength and peace for the journey.

#### Gift Cards for Sale After Church Services



Convenient Gift Cards for most grocery stores, dozens of retail stores, and coffee and sandwich shops are available for purchase after both services on Sundays.

The church receives between a 3 and 15 percent discount by purchasing these cards in bulk, and the money (a few thousand at last count) is deposited into the general account of the church.

Along with the regular gift card program, Thrivent Financial has provided us with a seed-grant of \$250 to be used to purchase grocery gift cards for those in need. If you would like to help out, you can purchase a gift card in any denomination to benefit this ministry. These donated cards will be given to Pastor Kohl and Karin to disburse to those in need as they see fit.

We don't have to get everything completely right. We can't. That's God's work and it has been done. So, good Christian friends, rejoice!
