#### From Our Pastor:

September is a time of new beginnings, you might even say a new birth in the program life of the church. Things pick up in September: Sunday School, choir, confirmation, adult education. It is something like a new life, and it comes to us filled with possibilities and hope.

But much has continued over the summer months also. Hungry people were fed, basic needs for health were given out, the Gospel continued to be preached, and Jesus came and met his people every Sunday in his word of forgiveness and bread and wine shared as his body and blood. Over the summer life went on: people were born, people were baptized, people got married, people got sick and went to the hospital, people were buried. Pretty much that is life in the parish. Pastors never know what any day will bring, and I have often joked about a TV series called Parish, not knowing from week to week if it would be a comedy or a tragedy. It could be either, and sometimes both come in the same day.

So it's time to think about the future. And I want to ask you a question that someone posed to me recently: what does it cost you to be a follower of Jesus? What's the cost of being a church member?

Certainly there is going without an extra hour of sleep or an extra cup of coffee. There may be the money we share in the offering. There might be one less round on the golf course. You know what your commitment to being a part of this community we call Pilgrim Lutheran Church costs you.

But it is easy for us to forget or take for granted what the benefits of being part of this congregation bring. I can think of no place else someone can go and be assured that God's forgiveness is the center of that group or institution's life. I suspect we might take forgiveness for granted rather than seeing it as an assist into a new way of living, a new way of being who God made you to be. In the church we also find something which many people seem to not think of as important, community, a life shared with others. Going it alone through life is not possible. That's why God built marriage into the very creation of the earth. God knew that no one should live apart from others so God made people "helpmeets" partners for one another. And what about hope? Where do you find it in the world? The hope we offer is that finally, when all is said and done, God will give a gift of life without limits to all who belong to God.

Faith is not simply the parsley on the plate of life, it is the main stuff of the meal. Faith is essential when our world seems to be falling apart. Faith that good is more important and life giving than hating others. Faith calls, not for proof of God's existence, but rather trusts that God exists **for you**. This is what we need.

So please, if you have been away for a while, come back and find the gifts of peace and forgiveness, of hope and trust that happen at Pilgrim every Sunday. One of the things you will learn is that the cost is worth it and the blessings come from places you did not expect them to.

# Confirmation



All our members and their friends in the seventh through ninth grades are invited to take part in our confirmation program beginning in September. The classes meet on Tuesdays beginning with supper at 6:30. The sessions end at 8:15. We share our confirmation classes with St. Paul Church. The program includes opportunities to build fellowship with one another and to serve others as well as instruction and conversation about our faith as Christians. The classes run in a three-year cycle which includes a year of Bible, a year of Catechism and history, and a year of looking at difficult topics. This year will be dedicated to issues kids and adults face. Some of the topics we will consider are internet safety, risky behavior, sex, money, addiction, and similar things. We try to include people's real life stories in each class. If you would like to suggest a topic,

Our confirmation program has made a difference in the lives of our students. It is an important ministry, done with love and respect for all involved.
